CHAT WITH THE PREACHER

The last few weeks I've been talking (i.e. preaching) about the strangeness of being Christian. I have done this *not* in the hopes that I would convince you to recant your faith. Instead, my hope is that the "strange talking" will convince us to take our faith more seriously.

Chances are, if you don't think that practicing the faith is a bit strange, then you probably do not have a good grasp on the type of living that Jesus calls us to. And if I never articulate another thing, I want to say clearly, that being Christian is a way of living. Too often in our part of the world (i.e. The Bible Belt) we think being Christian is essentially about believing that Jesus is God's son. And that is, of course, what we believe, but the language of Jesus himself was always more about "following" him than "believing" in him.

Most people who follow Jesus do believe in him, otherwise, why would they follow him? For some folks, however, it happens the other way around. Some people have to follow Jesus before they can believe in him. The point being, the strange acts of following Jesus (Lent, Bible, Sex, Worship, Sabbath, Death, and Resurrection—and these are just a few) are life-giving practices rather than life-taking ones.

These strange, and seemingly demanding practices, ultimately do more than lead us to believe in Jesus. Instead, this strange way of living leads us to Jesus. May God give us the grace and wisdom to embrace this strange-life-giving way of life.

Requirements for the Scholarship Application include the application itself, a recent photograph, a letter of acceptance from an accredited college, university, Bible or theological school, a short essay describing career goals, and two letters of recommendation in a sealed envelope, with the writer's signature across the seal. For renewals, applicants will need the form and a transcript of grades, showing that the student has maintained a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 at the institute at which they're studying. All scholarship applications and renewal forms are due in the church office no later than April 30, 2013. They are available in the office and in the church kitchen entrance.

Notes From Candy

The Psalmist has challenged us to "sing a new song to the Lord." Every day, each moment of our lives is a new song waiting to be sung, played, whistled, or hummed. During the season of Lent, it is good to examine our individual "songs," or lives, and determine how we can best play, sing, whistle, or hum that which God has given us. The Psalmist has also said: "Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name." When we offer our self, our total being to God in worship, we begin to experience the joy of the abundant life. In our corporate worship services, we can decide to participate more fully, sing the hymns more heartily, pray more fervently, and read the scripture with deep conviction.

It is a joy for me on Sundays when I look around the congregation and see children searching the hymnal for the correct hymn number, adults sharing their hymnals with children, and delight on the faces of everyone while singing those hymns. Eric Routley, 20th century hymnist, composer, and theologian said that a good hymn is one that is "well written, well chosen, and well sung." A vital element in congregational worship is hymn singing, for it is a time when the people of God unite in voicing their praise to the Creator. As our prayers and hymns ascend to our Maker, do we consider offering anything less than our Best?
