

Celebrating Baptism and the Lord's Supper Jeff Harris Baptism is a sign of our fellowship with the crucified and risen Lord.

We are buried with Christ in a watery grave, and we are raised by the Spirit to walk in the resurrection life of the new creation.

Our rebirth through the Holy Spirit is sealed in baptism until the Lord comes to consummate our salvation

Because we have been claimed in the waters of baptism, we are reminded that our lives are not our own but have been bought with a price.

Thus by baptism we enter into a covenant of mutual accountability and discipleship with the community of the faithful. The bread is a sign of Christ's body, and the cup is a sign of the new covenant in his blood.

As we remember Jesus in communion through the bread of fellowship and the cup of life, the Lord himself is with us declaring that we who are many are one body.

In the Lord's Supper the Spirit thus signifies and seals the covenant that makes us one with Christ and one in Christ with one another.
