Easter is the holiest day of the Christian year. The celebration of Jesus' resurrection from the dead is the validation of the very gospel he proclaimed. Paul said it this way, "If Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain" (I Corinthians 15:14). Simply put, Easter is a big deal for those of us committed to the ways of Jesus.

In order to prepare for this celebration of resurrection there is a season called Lent. Lent allows us to remember and retrace the life of Jesus, ultimately leading us to the cross. You see, there is no empty tomb without a body-filled cross. You cannot run past the sorrow of Holy Week—especially Good Friday—and actually arrive at the tomb. Therefore, Lent is an introspective gift that allows us to examine our lives in light of the gospel.

And in case we have forgotten just how strange this makes us, our Lenten worship will hopefully remind us.




