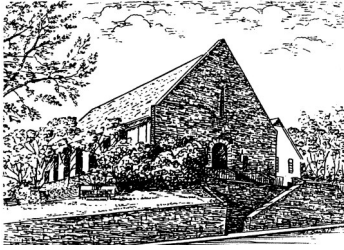

## Chat With the Preacher

An Experiment...

I love this time of year. Or at least I did when I was a student. And it's not because of the increasingly warm temperatures, or the mosquitoes that seem to accompany said temperatures. There are two words that capture my love of this season: "summer" and "break." Summer break is an amazing gift that you can only fully appreciate when you no longer have one.

A good friend of mine enjoyed summer break so much that he decided to become a teacher. Of course, that was not his only reason for his chosen vocation; he was also a fan of Christmas break.

One of the great benefits of school calendars is that there are clear beginnings and endings, with breaks in between. These beginnings, endings, and breaks provide a helpful rhythm that keep you engaged and fresh.

But the rest of the world rarely works this way. We have weekends and vacations to provide leisure and renewal, but we essentially live from one day to another without much distinction.

And while the church's calendar and the culture's calendar do provide rhythm and structure, neither provides anything like summer break.

With that said, I want us to try an experiment. (No, we are not taking the summer off. Sorry to disappoint you.)

Here's the experiment:

**We are going to adjust our meeting times for the month of July. In July, worship will begin at 9am, followed by a joint Sunday School at 10:15am in the Activity Building.**

We hope this early worship time will encourage better summer attendance. For example, if worship is at 9am, you can attend, and still have plenty of time for a picnic on the parkway, or a day at the lake, or a before-noon tee time.

This experiment also breaks up the monotony of our normal schedule, and that kind of change is beneficial.

So it's not summer break, but it is a different way to mark the time. I hope this experiment will encourage Sabbath worship, rest, and play.

## JUNE 12-14 SPIRITUALITY AND BACKPACK TRIP

We had a great time backpacking in the Roan Highlands last year, and we're looking forward to another great trip. This year we'll be trekking in the Pisgah National Forest and Shining Rock Wilderness from June 12-14. I hope you'll put it on your calendar.

The purpose of the backpacking trip is to provide an opportunity for Sabbath in a natural environment and to help participants explore opportunities for prayer and silence. We'll also have a lot of fun! This trip is open to anyone 16 or older who can carry at least 30 pounds on his/her back, while hiking 5 to 7 miles per day in mountainous terrain. If you are under 16, you must be accompanied by a parent.

Participants are required to bring their own back-pack, sleeping bag, sleeping pad, and tent/shelter. If you do not own these items, Sunrift Adventures in Travelers Rest rents them, or maybe you can borrow these items from someone. Also, many backpacking tents sleep two people, therefore not everyone has to have a tent. Stoves and other cooking gear can be shared as well. If you are interested in this trip, but do not have the equipment, please let Pastor Harris know, and he'll be glad to help.



## CAROWINDS TRIP, JUNE 18

We're going to Carowinds! This is a trip for the whole family. We'll depart for the park June 18 at 8:00am (from the Food Lion parking lot) and return no later than 8:00pm. Youth, children, and adults are invited and encouraged to participate! The cost of the trip is \$40, which includes an all-day pass to the park and transportation to and from the park via coachline. (with wifi). The purpose of this trip is to have fun and fellowship together—there will be no worries about parking, cost of gasoline, keeping up with a multi-vehicle convoy (which is dangerous), or back seat drivers. You must sign up and make a deposit of \$20 per person by May 31. Important things to note: we **will not** make use of the waterpark that day, and children who have not completed the third grade must be accompanied by a parent.

## **JUNE MISSIONS OPPORTUNITY**

Our June mission involves us with Thermal Belt Outreach Ministry. While we collect funds for their Food Pantry every third Sunday, we also have a chance to help eradicate hunger by collecting food throughout the month. There will be a collection box in the Lair Sunday School Room, and here are the items we've been tasked with collecting this month: jelly, syrup, hand soap, soup, and instant potatoes. All cans should be 14-15 oz. Thank you for your donations—it will make a difference. Together we can end hunger.

## **COMMIT TO THE MISSION INITIATIVE DAY OCTOBER 3**

We are asking our congregation to make a commitment to help our extended community on October 3 of this year. The Mission Initiative Project and GraceItForward represent a time to put hearts and hands toward the mission of reaching out to those who may be hungry, who may not be able to do their own yardwork, who may need a construction project or who may need a helping hand in other ways. Last year, we handed out change for folks to do their laundry; gave away McDonald's gift cards; sang, played games, and did craft projects with local nursing home residents, as well as pulled weeds, chopped wood, built a ramp, collected food, and tried to make a difference in our county. We're asking for your help again this year. Commitment slips were in the bulletin on May 31st, and there is a sign-up sheet in the Education hallway. Please consider giving a few hours of your time—we can use your help in the morning or the afternoon. Prayerfully consider how you can help, and commit today!
