First Baptist Family,

On January 17, 2017, the Board of Deacons appointed an Ad Hoc Team to study the needs of our facilities.

The Deacons asked us to assess the following: the possibility of an elevator, handicap accessibility, the entrance to the basement area, educational space, sanctuary lighting, and any other facility needs we identified. Our team has met at least once a month since our first meeting on January 31, 2017. Because the Deacons appointed our committee, we have shared reports and updates at their monthly meetings.

In May, the congregation helped our efforts by responding to a facility survey. Almost 100 of you responded to the survey and we are grateful for your input. The survey confirms that our team is heading in the right direction. The results are listed on the back of this letter for your review.

Initially, we hoped to share our recommendation with you in September, but that deadline has not been met. We now believe our recommendation will be made to the congregation in April or May of 2018. We are committed to getting this right, and request your patience and prayers as we continue to work through this process.

Highlights from the Facility Survey:

-For all nine statements, at least 70 percent of the responses were either STRONGLY AGREE, AGREE, or NEUTRAL.

-For all statements, except number 7 (storage space), at least 50 percent of the responses were AGREE or STRONGLY AGREE. Over 50% of the responders were neutral on the need for more storage.

-The highest levels of agreement were on the need for handicap accessibility (94%), upgrading restrooms (80%), updating the educational wing (69%), installing an elevator (67%), and providing a welcoming, easy-to-use church entrance and gathering area (56%).

-The only two statements with which more than 20 percent of the respondents disagreed were the need to improve sanctuary lighting (29% disagreement) and paving the gravel parking lots (23%). Over half the respondents for both of these questions, how-ever, AGREED or STRONGLY AGREED.

The collection dates are November 13 - 20. We will have the cardboard shoeboxes available in the narthex and near the water fountain in the Sunday School hallway effective October 1 to give you over a month to fill your shoebox for Operation Christmas Child. We hope to send at least 100 filled shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child from our church this year.

It's hard for us to imagine not having a toothbrush or having to share with several with several other siblings if the family had any toothbrushes at all.
